Join the Discussion

Women's Issues had its first meeting in September with 12 present. National AAUW women's topics were reviewed alongside local statistics and issues that affect women and



girls. We had two jobs: (1) to determine what we may want to study and/or take action on this year, and (2) determine what to bring to the table at the community meeting of women's groups October 1. (Redding AAUW is bringing diverse women's groups together to see if as a group we can collectively create positive change in Shasta County.) We agreed to present the following three topics at the community meeting:

- 1. Women's Reproductive Health Care—including Prenatal Care
- 2. Women's Mental Health Care
- 3. Social Determinants of Women's Health influenced by poverty, ACEs, housing, domestic abuse, employment

Women's Issues will meet on the 2nd Tuesdays of Oct. and Nov. at 6:00 pm at Pilgrim Congregational Church (2850 Foothill Blvd.) with a simple potluck. Watch for details! Enter the lower parking lot off Las Animas Street and enter through the side door on the main level.

From AAUW California Public Policy Committee:

When Women Vote, They Change the Conversation!

AAUW California supports the passage of Propositions 1 and 28 on the November ballot in California.

Proposition 1: The Constitutional Right to Reproductive Freedom

The decision by the Supreme Court of the United States to overturn Roe v. Wade dealt a serious blow to the rights of women to make their own decision about their bodies. California legislators, recognizing the remote possibility that at some future time state legislation could ban abortions, took timely action in June to pass SCR 10. This put Proposition 1 on the November ballot. Passage of Proposition 1 will amend the California Constitution, stating "Section 1.1 is added to Article I thereof, to read: SEC. 1.1. The state shall not deny or interfere with an individual's reproductive freedom in their most intimate decisions, which includes their fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and their fundamental right to choose or refuse contraceptives. . ." AAUW CA has begun a Social Media campaign to educate and encourage voters to support Proposition 1. Weekly messages contain important facts. We urge you to share the messages!

Proposition 28: The Arts and Music in Schools -Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act In the context of AAUW CA's Public Policy Priorities in support of Education, AAUW CA supports Proposition 28. Studies on educational achievement prove that arts and music education improve student learning. Proposition 28 would provide a minimum source of annual funding coming from the state General Fund to K-12 public schools to supplement arts education programs. School districts would be held accountable to use the funds for hiring certificated employees and purchasing supplies and materials. 

But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car.



Together, they have hatched a different plan for Emmett's future, one that will take them on a fateful journey in the opposite direction - to the City of New York.
