We are pretty excited about their new robotics and CIS (Computer Information Systems) building and equipment as well as their multiple computer labs! Yay! ## Public Policy Notes for November

**PLEASE REMEMBER TO VOTE ON OR PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 8, 2022!**



November is **Native American Heritage Month**, or as it is commonly referred to, American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month.

Shasta County has several tribes:

The **Wintu Tribe** of Northern CA manage the Wintu Museum and Cultural Resource Center in the City of Shasta Lake.

The **Winnemem Tribe** are the indigenous peoples of the McCloud River.

The **Nor Rel Muk Wintu Nation** make their traditional homeland in the headwaters of the South Fork of the Trinity River. Their territory is primarily in Trinity County and western Shasta County.

The **Pit River** is a recognized tribe composed of eleven autonomous bands whose ancestral lands are located in northeastern Shasta County. Nine bands speak Achumawi and two speak Atsugewi. Each of the bands is represented in the tribal council.

The **Redding Rancheria** is federally recognized and originated in the 1920s as a place for homeless Indians to live. Their members are of Pit River, Wintu and Yana descent.

Native American Heritage Month is a time to celebrate rich and diverse cultures, traditions, and histories and to acknowledge the important contributions of Native people. It is also an opportune time to educate the public about tribes, to raise a general awareness about the unique challenges Native people have faced both historically and in the present, and the ways in which tribal citizens have worked to conquer these challenges.

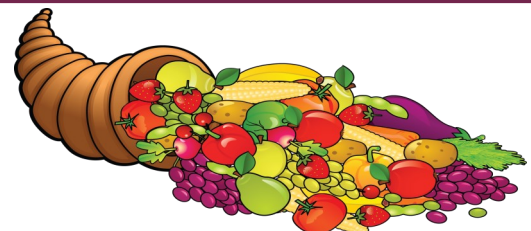

Look for signs of historic residences that housed local workers employed in mining. 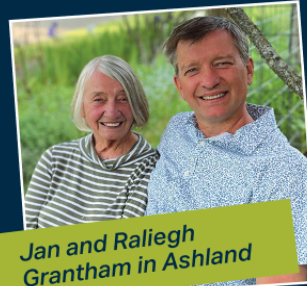
