

Thanks to All Who Contributed to the Success of our Online Auction!

Our fall online auction raised funds for local scholarships and for National AAUW's Greatest Needs Fund (advocacy, education, outreach programs for women nation-wide). It ran from Oct. 17 – Nov. 6 with 41 items that received 144 bids. Twenty-three community sponsors, seven AAUW Interest Groups, and many individuals donated both auction items and time to make the auction a success. A special shout out to Noella Pearson, Lana Hill, Maureen Chenoweth and Sharon Clairemont who provided invaluable marketing tools and expertise, guidance and help on how to run an online auction, and a life lesson on wrapping gift baskets. As a result of all who contributed to the effort, the auction netted \$3,027.66, which was 90% of the proposed goal of \$3,500.



Women in STEM Conference Saturday - March 18, 2023 SAVE THE DATE

I could not be more pleased to share that the Women in STEM Conference 2023 is well underway thanks to the efforts and dedication of so many amazing women in our Branch, brilliant

presenters who are returning this year and many generous sponsors.

As we recruit this year's professional STEM women presenters, we have a focus on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. We want the girls to see themselves in our professional women. As of the writing of this article, we have 21 confirmed presenters with at least 5 more who are very likely to present. Shasta College has agreed to allow us into their new CIS building and state-of-the-art robotics lab. Eleven laboratories, two computer labs, about a dozen classrooms, gym and cafeteria are all reserved for our use.

PUBLIC POLICY: WHAT IS CULTURAL HUMILITY?

For this year's final article on *Public Policy* and *Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion*, I want to talk about cultural humility. Cultural humility is defined as a practice of self-reflection on how one's own background and the background of others impact teaching, learning, research, creative activity, engagement, leadership, etc.

Cultural humility involves an ongoing process of self-exploration and self-critique combined with a willingness to learn from others. It means entering a relationship with another person with the intention of honoring their beliefs, customs, and values. It means acknowledging differences and accepting that person for who they are.

This year we will step into a culture that most of us have heard about but few of us really know about. We are going to explore, just briefly, the culture of gnomes. Some of you will ask, "What is a gnome?" and I will answer, "There is a lot to know about a gnome."



Gnomes are very widespread, through Europe and Russia in particular. They have been known to humans for centuries (although rarely seen) and are believed to have originated in Scandinavia and migrated to the lowlands some 1500 years ago.

Gnomes are usually about 6 inches tall, but some are taller. The males weigh about 11 ounces and females weigh about 9 ounces. Most gnomes are 7 times stronger than a man, can run at speeds of 35 miles per hour and have better sight than a hawk. Their feet are somewhat pigeon toed which gives them extra speed and agility through the woods and grass. Generally, when things go well, a gnome lives for about 400 years. Each couple has one set of twins during this time.

A Gnome's Christmas by Rien Poortvliet is a delightful child's book that talks about gnomes and the wonderful habits they bring to Christmas. This year I bought a book for every young child in my family with a small gnome as a token of remembrance and a reminder of the need for cultural humility in our world.


