Women in STEM Conference - March 18

THANK YOU to all the volunteers who helped with the Women in STEM Conference and to the dozens of generous members who carefully planned and filled baskets for the event! We could not do it without YOU!

After a three-year absence due to COVID restrictions, we had a very successful conference at Shasta College. We are still collecting data and have not yet had a debrief meeting, but we can report that approximately 200 girls, 53 adults (teachers and parents) and nearly

100 volunteers and presenters were on-

campus, as well as Shasta College support staff.

Approximately 45 schools from across the north state, as well as homeschooled girls, attended the event. Energy and excitement were high all day as girls attended four interactive presentations that they had selected from 21 STEM career pathways. We will post a photo album of the event on Facebook soon.

After our debrief meeting and once the data is finalized, we will be present our final report to the Board. Once accepted, the report will be available to members.

Mari has been a member of AAUW 12 years, joining the Redding Branch in 2016. She has served in various positions and on a number of committees. Undoubtedly, two stints in the Peace Corps, one in Colombia and then the Solomon Island, plus 15 years' employment at EDD, led to organizational skills that she has put to excellent use for the Branch. Leveraging her Spanish language fluency, she obtained a bilingual teaching credential, enriched the educational experiences of 1st and 2nd graders in Gerber School and honed skills useful for leading various Branch activities.

She served on the Home Tour and STEM committees, even volunteering her own home as a one of the 50th Anniversary Home Tour Houses. From 2020-2021, she was the Program VP, and although COVID made in-face meetings impossible, she created programs, aired via ZOOM, that were both educational and inspirational, like a Homage to Ruth Bader Ginsburg. In 2021-2022, as President-elect she led a committee that took on the important task of reviewing and revising the Branch By-laws and Standing Rules. Now as 2022-2023 President, she coordinated the activities of several committees that culminated in a new multi-day, fall scholarship fundraiser, called Three Days of Art in Caldwell Park, that included the AAUW Art Show, Starry Night of Art and Wine and the Kids Artfest that coordinated with the AAUW Fund On-line Auction. Not one to rest on her laurels, she then inspired the Branch to take a leadership role in a multi-organization Women of Shasta County Networking group as well as leading the Interactive Science Stations for the 2023 Stem Conference.

She retired from teaching in 2006 and, now in addition to all she does for AAUW, she is a member of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and the California Retired Teachers Assoc., tutors as a Redding Library literacy volunteer, tends a large garden and although a lapsed Master Gardener, still helps other gardeners.




