Josh Hoines, the Superintendent of Whiskeytown National Recreation Area, will share his experiences and knowledge of Whiskeytown Lake and the land surrounding it. He was named superintendent in 2018 and was immediately responsible for overseeing recovery from the Carr Fire. He has a bachelors degree in biology, a graduate degree in restoration ecology and work experience in Death Valley National Park and Joshua Tree National Park, making him well qualified for disaster recovery, conservation and restoration in the Whiskeytown Lake Recreation Area. He will speak to us not only about recovery efforts but also about activities in the park, the role of Whiskeytown Lake as a water source, opportunities for women in the park service, and future plans for the area.

Also joining us at this meeting will be the 2024 Tech Trek girls sharing their experience from this summer.

**Welcome** to an AAUW year filled with opportunities to support our CA Public Policy Priorities and local Diversity, Equity & Inclusion.

#### First, Public Policy

What is this? The AAUW-CA Public Policy Program establishes policy directives that guide our legislative bill-support and serve our AAUW mission. These priorities are based on the input of each AAUW-CA member. Look for your **survey in November** for your Public Policy ideas.

**Action Alerts** are for supporting important California legislation and are separate from AAUW national's Two-Minute Activists. Sign up for Action Alerts <u>HERE</u>.

Remember AAUW is a non-partisan, politically active organization. We can and do support women's rights and issues, but not specific candidates. On your November ballot there are four propositions that align with our Public Policy Priorities. AAUW-CA urges **a YES vote** on **Propositions 2, 3, 4 and 32.** To see our full article on these propositions and how they will advance gender equity and AAUW California PPPs, please see the September issue of <u>Public Policy News</u>

The AAUW-CA "School Board Project" continues with many state branches involved as the concerns over book banning and the safety of all our students locally and in all CA public schools continues. Several Shasta County school board candidates will be on our November ballot. Do their views align with AAUW's mission?

#### Secondly, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion or DEI

Lata Murti, our state director of DEI, feels that "DEI is for all of us. AAUW's survival as an organization depends on our commitment to DEI."



#### The Tea Girl of Hummingbird Lane by Lisa See

New York Times best-selling author Lisa See explores the lives of a Chinese mother and her daughter who has been abandoned and adopted by an American couple.

Li-yan and her family align their lives around the seasons and the farming of tea. There is ritual and routine, and it has been ever thus for generations.

Li-yan, one of the few educated girls on her mountain, is among the first to reject the rules that have shaped her existence. When she has a baby outside of wedlock, rather than stand by tradition, she wraps her daughter in a blanket, with a tea cake hidden in her swaddling, and abandons her in the nearest city.

A powerful story about a family separated by circumstances, culture, and distance, *The Tea Girl of Hummingbird Lane* paints an unforgettable portrait of a little known region and its people and celebrates the bond that connects mothers and daughters.
