

Our Redding AAUW branch is full of women who are active in the community and have worked to make Shasta County a better place. On Thursday evening, February 13, Darlene Brown will tell us about many of the strong, determined, resilient women from the 19th and 20th centuries who were groundbreakers in science, teaching, health care, politics, and business. They were women who were not afraid to challenge gender roles and became leaders in Shasta County. The individual stories of 54 women

such as Marie Carr, Edna Eaton, Mabel Frisbie, Isaac Lowe, and Leah McConnell are captured in the Shasta Lake Historical Society's book EMPOWERED WOMEN OF SHASTA COUNTY which reads like a historical novel. If you would like a copy you can find the book at all of our local museums.

#### **Help Us Reach Scholarship Applicants**


The AAUW scholarship application period started January 3 ,2025 and we need your help to get the workd out to potential applicants . Women applicants need to have finished two years of study at Shasta Community College and be entering a four year institution or equivalent certificate program such as Ultrasound Technician, Nursing , or Respiratory Therapy. Awards are from \$1000 to \$5000.

Last year's applicants all learned about the scholarship from their professors or flyers at Shasta College. If you have contacts with professors or folks who have contact with students at Shasta College it would be very helpful if you could send them an email or make a call asking them to encourage eligible women to apply. Please notify the education committee and we will be happy to follow up. If you know women who are transferring from Shasta College please encourage them to apply. The application is available on the Redding AAUW website and on the external scholarship page for Shasta College.


February 13, 3:00 pm




## Drama Divas Wednesday, February 5, 1-4 pm Hostess: Shirley Ramstrom


