After meeting all the applicants and reviewing their applications we made some difficult decisions and were able to award six women scholarships, declined two applicants and suggested that a third applicant apply next year. To the women who did not get a scholarship this year we gave a letter stating they were scholarship finalists.

The winners are **Raina Baney**- She has been a Resident Assistant at the Shasta College dormitory and has won

numerous awards in her home town of Needles including multiple cross-country honors. She will go to Cal State Long Beach in the Fall where she will study Psychology.

**Deanna Madigan** – She applied last year and was not going on to university yet so reapplied this year. She sold a nursery business to be able to pursue her education and has been active in the transitional students' programs at Shasta College. She is passionate about the need to preserve our planet and building community. She will be attending Cal State Polytechnic University, Humboldt in the Fall.

*Monica Sheldon*- Monica is a widow who has a 7-year-old son. She moved from the Bay Area to be able to come to Shasta College and get an affordable education. She will be attending Nursing School this Fall, likely at Simpson University.

#### How Round Robin works:

• Members read recently published (in the past two years) hardback books, both fiction and non-fiction.

- Books are chosen in July from a ballot composed of suggestions from Round Robin members.
- \$20 a year is the total cost. A best seller for \$2 a month!
- Members receive a new book on the 1st of each month, beginning in September. This book is rotated to the next person on your group list at the end of the month. We currently have two rotation groups of 10 members each.
- Members do not meet monthly to discuss the books, but gather in June every year to share our reading experiences and suggest books for the next year.
- Books are collected in the spring and sold at the September meeting, with proceeds going to AAUW projects.

We finished our 24th season of play reading with a delicious potluck lunch at the home of Mari Ennis-Applegate. We read *Twelve Angry Men* by Reginald Rose with a good discussion. During our 24 years we have read at least 192 plays and this next year it will reach 200.
